Swisscom TV plus and basic packages

* A compulsory royalties fee of CHF 2.25 a month is also charged.

** You can choose whichever language pack you prefer (German, French or Italian). This determines which channels you receive and the order in which they are arranged (see www.swisscom.ch/tv for an overview). You also receive additional channels in your chosen language free of charge.

Set up Swisscom TV early on your own

You can set up Swisscom TV on your own. This way, there is no installation charge to pay. CHF 0.–
(Please note that only one Swisscom TV box can be installed on each line for Swisscom TV basic.)

Home installation by a technician

A technician will come to your home, set up your Swisscom TV and show you how to use it.

Swisscom TV plus:

Home installation by a technician on one TV set. CHF 290.–

If you want a second TV box at the same time, you will be charged an extra CHF 95.

If you want a technician to install a second TV box at your home at a later date, the charge will be CHF 195.–

Swisscom TV basic:

Home installation by a technician. CHF 290.–
(Please note that only one Swisscom TV box can be installed on each line for Swisscom TV basic.)

Swisscom DSL

DSL is required for Swisscom TV in addition to a TV-compatible phone line because it is used to transmit the TV signal. However, you do not need a computer to receive Swisscom TV. DSL start is sufficient for Swisscom TV. There is a connection charge of CHF 3 an hour for using DSL start (capped at CHF 59 a month), but there is no connection charge for watching TV.

Recommended hardware (optional)

Wireless connection kit

CHF 169.–

This connection kit allows you to set up the best possible wireless connection between your Swisscom TV box and your DSL modem (/DSL router). Signal transmission is effected with WPA encryption. The 2 adapters are preconfigured and only need to be plugged in (plug and play). Uses other than Swisscom TV are not supported.

Wireless HDTV connection kit

CHF 199.–

The HDTV connection kit has the same functions as the wireless connection kit. It is, however, specially designed for the transmission of HDTV signals between the Swisscom TV box and the DSL modem (/DSL router). In the case of the wireless HDTV connection kit there should not be too great a distance or too many obstacles between the two adapters.

Optical connection kit

CHF 99.–

This kit makes it easier to plug everything in. It contains a 50-metre ultra-thin cable and all the accessories you need to set up the fastest possible connection between your Swisscom TV box, your DSL modem (/DSL router), your computer or other Internet-enabled devices. The advantage of the optical connection kit is that, because the optical cable is thinner than a standard Ethernet cable, it is much easier to install and conceal.

Powerline connection kit

CHF 169.–

The Powerline connection kit connects your DSL modem (/DSL router) to your Swisscom TV box via the mains supply. Conveniently, it is not necessary to lay any cables as there are always sufficient power sockets already present. However, connection via the mains supply is also somewhat precarious. Household equipment that is connected to the mains supply (microwave, vacuum cleaner, etc.) are sources of interference and can affect optimal data transmission. A Powerline connection kit should therefore always be plugged directly into a wall socket and never into a multiple socket extension lead.
