**Signature Rules** 





## 1. General definition of the types of authorised signatories

Swisscom Ltd and the subsidiaries belonging to the Group (hereinafter collectively referred to as 'Swisscom companies') cannot 'act for themselves' or sign letters and contracts. They must be represented. In business transactions, Swisscom companies are bound by the signatures of governing bodies and employees who are authorised signatories, or whose position (e.g. staff in Swisscom shops) gives them the authority to act in a certain way on behalf of the companies. Signatures are generally provided **by two people (collective signature of two)**. The rules applicable to the **external representation of Swisscom companies** are set out below in table form along with examples. The 'Organisational Rules of Swisscom Ltd' regulate the signatory powers of the members and of the members of the Board of Directors and the Group Executive Board of Swisscom Ltd.

The signature on the left is for control purposes and is provided by the line manager or by the authority with the corresponding powers (this regulation corresponds to the guidelines of the Swiss Commercial Employees Association and is in general use).		
Deputisati on	In the absence of an authorised signatory, their deputy shall sign. The deputies have the same power of attorney in the area of the deputised persons as the deputised persons themselves (therefore they sign with their name, without having to mention 'pp'). Signing a document with 'pp' above the name of another authorised agent is only permitted in exceptional cases when a document has already been prepared and the person designated by name is absent. In the case of letters with binding content, this approach should be avoided altogether.
