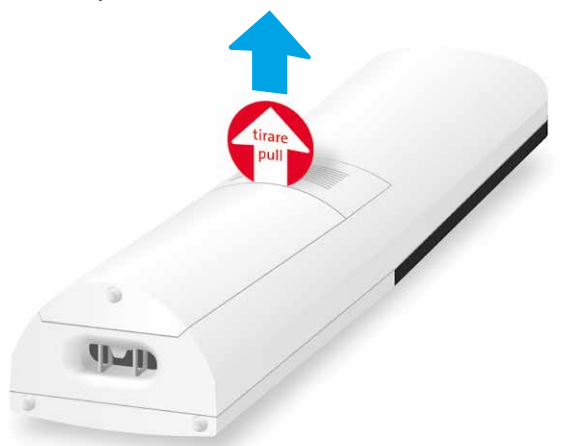


1 You have one of these Internet-Boxes.



Your Internet-Box must be installed and switched on.

2 Pull the red tab out from the phone.

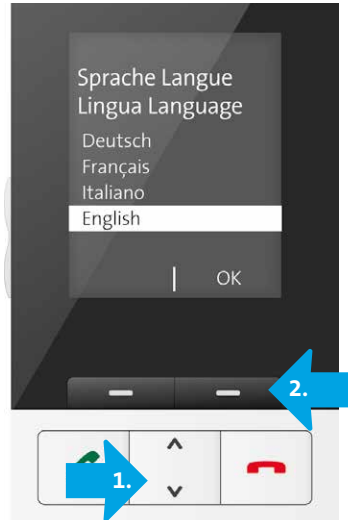


You do not have to remove the battery compartment cover.

3 Select your language.



4 Take your HD-Phone close to your Internet-Box.

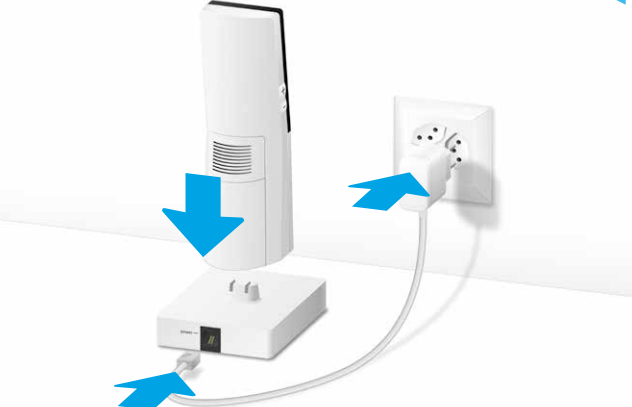


7 Easily transfer your smartphone contacts to your HD-Phone. Please refer to the «**Phonebook**» section on the backside.



You have now set up your HD-Phone Montreux.

6 Connect the adapter to the power socket of your choice.



We recommend you to charge your HD-Phone for 12 hours without interruption after set-up.

5 Press the + button on your Internet-Box.



Wait for the HD-Phone to connect.
If connecting your Internet-Box didn't work, repeat steps 4 - 5.

HD telephony

What does HD quality mean?

HD stands for High Definition. HD telephony means making calls in high sound quality.
If both you and the person you are calling are using an HD-Phone, your conversation will be in HD quality.

MultiLINE option

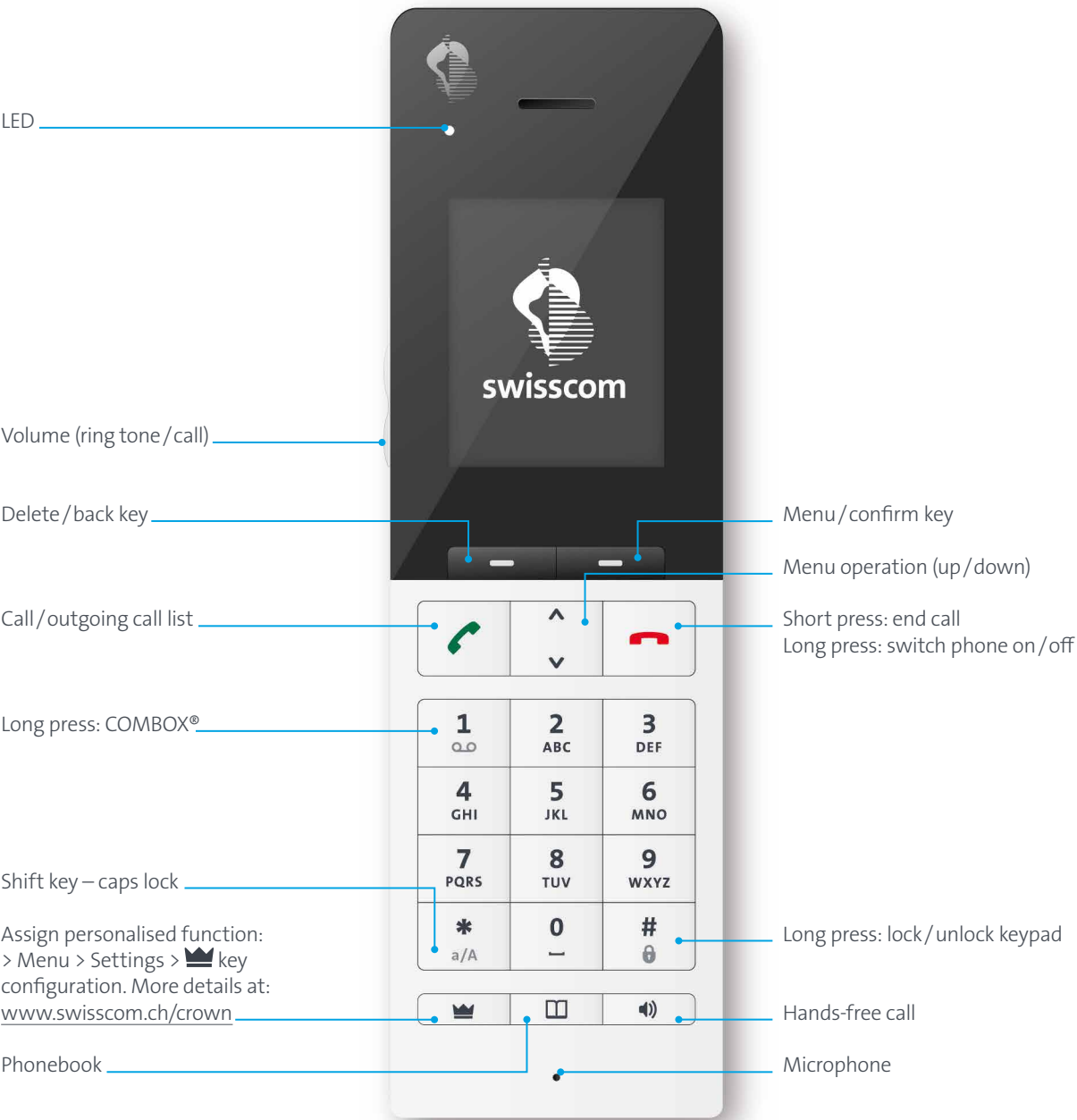

Keys and functions



Display icons



The antenna display indicates 0 – 4 bars depending on signal strength. The antenna display flashes when the phone is out of range.
Phone not within range > Reduce the distance to your base station.



Ecomode plus
Ecomode plus is an environmentally friendly system that reduces electricity consumption and offers a variable reduction of transmission power. Transmission power is reduced by 100% as soon as Ecomode plus is activated.



Charge level display
The charge level display flashes when the battery is empty.



Handset is not registered > please register

LED behaviour



Flashing red: handset is not registered



Flashing white (fast): incoming call
Flashing white (slow): missed call

Manual connection

You can connect the HD-Phone to the Internet-Box / base station manually.
Press > Menu > Settings > Advanced settings > Connection > Connect > OK, and then press the + button on the Internet-Box.

Safety instructions

Please note

- > Protect your hearing: Ringtones and notification alerts are transmitted on the handset over the loudspeaker. Please do not hold the handset up to your ear when one of those functions is switched on – your hearing may otherwise be impaired.
- > In case of power outage, no emergency calls can be made with this handset. Please ensure that other calling options are available if needed.
- > Only use the handset in ambient temperatures from +5 to +40 degrees Celsius and protect it from direct sunlight
- > Do not use the handset/charger in potentially explosive environments (e.g. paintshops, petrol stations etc.).
- > Do not place the handset /charger in bathrooms or wet areas.
- > Use only the adapter supplied.

Impairment due to radio signals

- > The functioning of medical equipment may be impaired by the radio signals.
- > Hearing device wearers should note that when using the handset, radio signals in the hearing device might interfere and cause unpleasant buzzing sounds.

Rechargeable batteries

- > Please use only NiMH AAA rechargeable batteries.
- > Do not use any other chargers, as the rechargeable batteries may otherwise be damaged.
- > Avoid batteries coming into contact with water or fire.
- > During charging batteries may heat up. This is normal and not dangerous.
