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


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




History has shown that technical developments always went hand in hand with new customer requirements

### Bandwidths – yesterday, today, tomorrow



#### **Driving forces**

- More bandwidth per application: Continual improvement in quality of media (picture resolution, sound etc) and electronic equipment (screens etc).
- More symmetrical bandwidth
   (downstream/ upstream): Services and
   applications with user-generated content
- More bandwidth per household: Consumer behaviour is increasingly tending towards the simultaneous usage of different media
- Slight time delay in transmission: Due to increasing interaction, increasing demand for little delay




#### The Swisscom broadband network
