



# What has Swisscom done to date?







#### Price transparency & cost tracking at Swisscom



As soon as they cross the border, customers receive an **SMS containing information on tariffs** for the country they are visiting





#### Simple cockpit for greater cost security

- Free access to data roaming cockpit at http://drt.swisscom.ch
- The standard limit is CHF 200 for mobile surfing when abroad
- individually adjustable
- Overview of monthly costs incurred for data roaming
- Real-time cost tracking







### Optimum cost tracking thanks to continual SMS notifications

- SMS notification at CHF 50 intervals for mobile surfing abroad
- SMS notification when 70% of personal cost limit has been reached

#### No unexpectedly high bills thanks to cost tracking

- SMS notification when data roaming cost limit has been reached
- No more data roaming allowed
- Personal limit can be adjusted at any time in the data roaming cockpit




# Swisscom is by far the cheapest roaming provider in Switzerland





Comparison of Swiss providers' prices for outgoing calls to Switzerland from abroad






#### Also compared to providers outside Switzerland, Swisscom offers very attractive terms


# What does Swisscom plan to do in future?



## Swisscom's promise to customers: prices will continue to drop in the future



- Between now and 2014, Swisscom customers will enjoy annual reductions of 5 cents per minute for telephoning within Europe
- This represents a price reduction of around CHF 30 million





#### Swisscom is committed to affordable communications for its customers – also when abroad







- From 2012, prepaid customers abroad will also be able to communicate more cheaply by mobile phone
- Swisscom also intends to gradually lower its data roaming prices over the coming years




# The cost of sending SMS messages in Europe is by far the lowest with Swisscom





#### Comparison of SMS standard tariffs in Europe






# Swisscom offers globally competitive tariffs for telephony



Comparison of European providers' prices (standard tariffs) for outgoing phone calls from abroad to the country of origin



## SMS standard tariffs for non-EU countries — Swisscom is one of the cheapest providers




## Swisscom is the cheapest data roaming provider - by a long shot





Comparison of European providers' prices (standard tariffs) for data roaming in non-EU countries





# In the latest OECD report on data roaming, Switzerland comes out extremely well: prices are well below the OECD average
